The library will nouse an extensive reference collection, and will include books and periodicals, as well as films, correspondence, archives, design sketches and other production

According to Prof. Gilbert G. Wright, 910 W. Park, C, president of the Foundation, no announcement as to the proposed site can be made at this time.

The University of Illinois Library is cooperating with the Foundation in hopes of obtaining a renowned dance collection currently on the market, to serve as a nuclear for further acquisitions.
